Your feedback helps build a clearer picture of where improvements are needed, supporting better connectivity for homes and businesses.

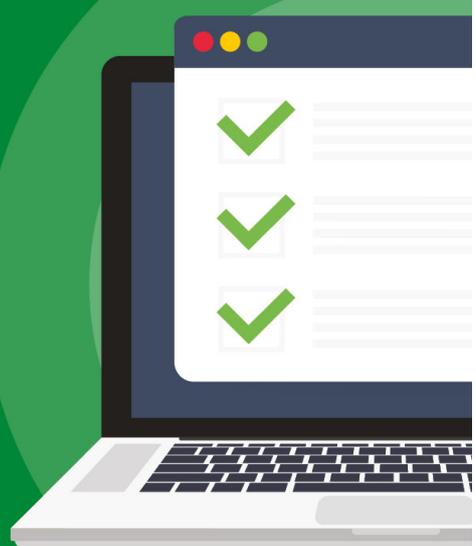

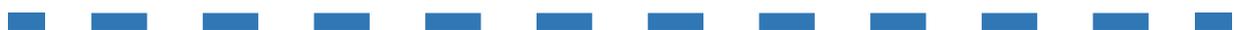

For three days only, from Saturday 21 to Monday 23 February, Salisbury Railway Station will host The Inspiration Tour — a unique exhibition train on a year-long journey across Britain. This family-friendly experience is free to enter, but booking is essential as few places remain available. Over 50,000 visitors have already enjoyed the exhibition, make sure you're next!

Travel by train, bus (lots of buses pass close to the station and all single fares are £3 or less) or car - use one of five Park & Ride sites and benefit from free parking and buses every 30 minutes. Return tickets cost £3.50 for adults or £4.50 for a group of up to four.
